In an effort to find reliable methodology for determining radiation's adverse effects during treatment, under a two-year, Phase II NCI Agreement, scientists in California will collaborate with Paul Okunieff, MD, Chair of the Department

of Radiation Oncology, and the University of Florida Health Cancer Center Radiation Oncology team, on the development of **a radiation toxicity biomarker**. Blood specimens collected from up to 500 patients undergoing radiotherapy for prostate cancer at multiple
